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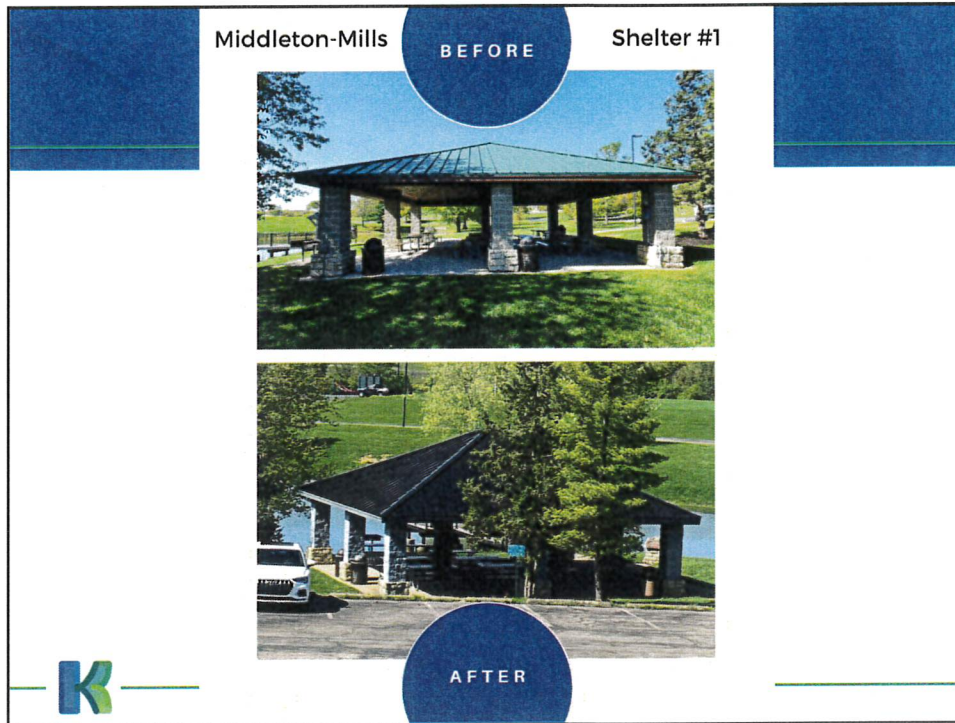
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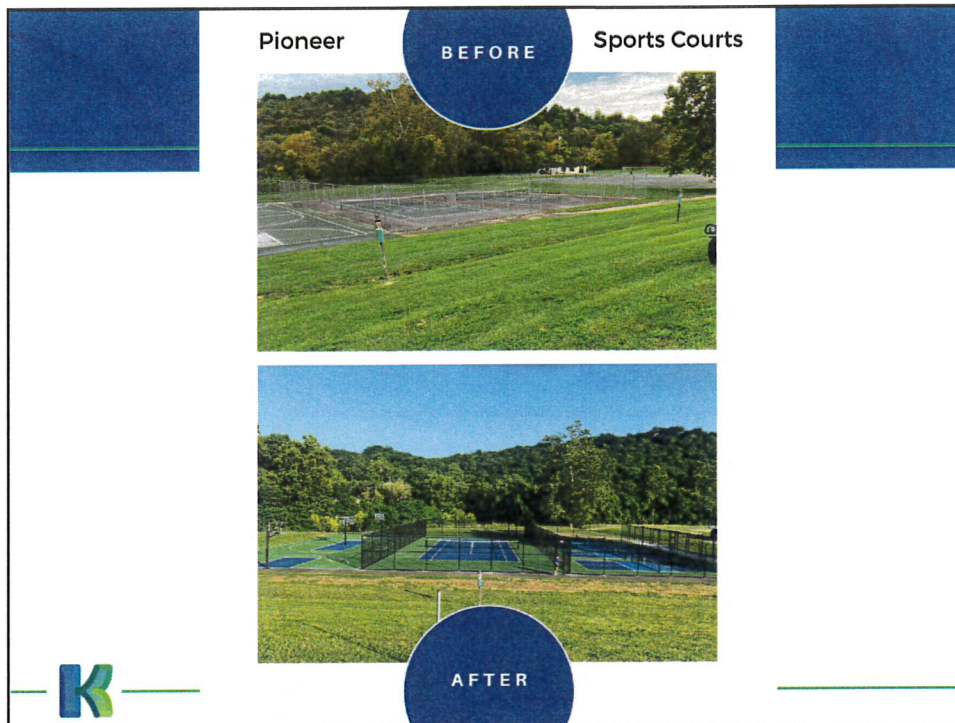
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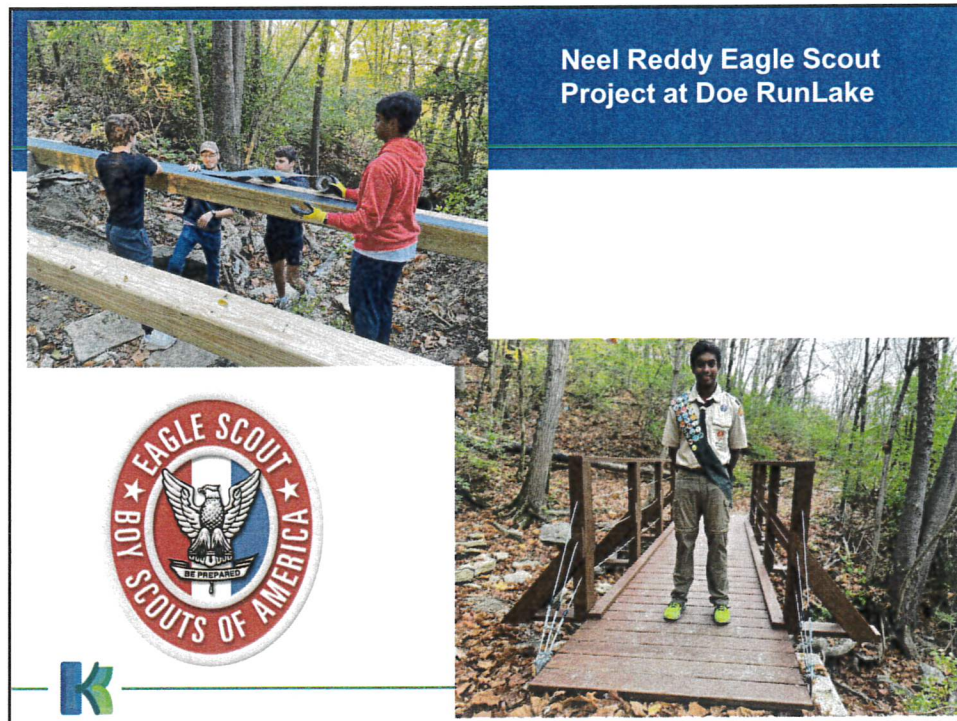
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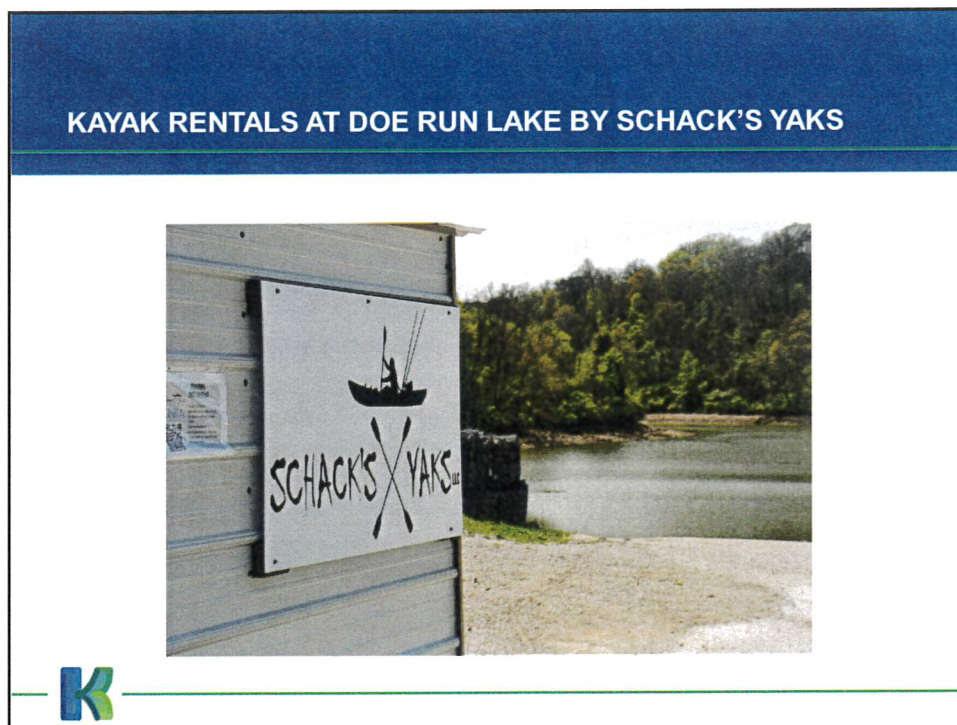
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AEDs – 11 AEDs PLACED IN 5 PARKS

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- Letters to Santa, Letters from Santa 2024 - 1822 letters sent; 1994 letters received; 393 non-perishable items
- Northern KY Senior Games – January – 230 people joined in 12 events held in Boone, Kenton and Campbell Counties; May – 302 people joined in 14 events held in Boone, Kenton and Campbell Counties
- 2547 participants at 10 Wild Wednesdays, 6 (Almost) Every Other Thursday Sciences, and 8 Art in the Park
- 819 lunches; Collaborated with Kenton County Schools for WW



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- 925 participants in KCPL programs – Health & Wellness Expo and End of Summer Fest
- 38 participants at 2 sessions of Pickleball 101
- 1699 participants for Haunted Trail
- 517 participants for Boo Bash & Trail Trek and collaboration with Girls Scouts of Kentucky's Wilderness Road



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
