FULL TIME QRT/POLICE OFFICER

GENERAL NATURE OF WORK

This is skilled and responsible work in a cohort/ team environment to address the opioid overdose epidemic and assist Kenton County overdose victims with recovery. Works under the direction of the Kenton County Police Chief's Office, or their designee. Work is performed in both office and field settings on a fixed schedule in all weather conditions.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

On a weekly basis, conduct research and maintain statistics on opioid overdose victims

Develop rapport with victims and family members of opioid overdose

Observe, report and act upon conditions conducive to opioid overdose

Work with QRT members to provide treatment and counseling options to opioid overdose victims

Assist the public in emergency and non-emergency situations; administers first aid and request appropriate medical / police response; educates the public on the dangers of opioid use and overdose

Prepare a variety of written and oral reports

When necessary appear in court to testify on behalf of the Commonwealth

Maintain proficiency in the use of police related equipment

Perform other duties as assigned

DESIRABLE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Knowledge of Kenton County Ordinances, State and Federal laws. Departmental policies and procedures; laws of arrest and search and seizure; techniques of interview and interrogation; criminal case preparation; crime scene management; oral and written communication skills.

Analyze dangerous situations rapidly and accurately before taking safe effective action; enforce federal, state and municipal laws; work with the public in a courteous respectful manner.

Knowledge of the QRT vehicle, police radio, handgun and other weapons as required, handcuffs, first aid equipment, personal computer including word processing software

NECESSARY SPECIAL REQUIRMENTS

Each applicant for employment in the Classified Service must be a citizen of the United States.

Applicant must be a POPS certified Police Officer as defined by Kentucky Revised Statute or have equivalent training that is transferable under Kentucky Law Enforcement Counsel Regulations.

Applicant must have a minimum of two years of law enforcement experience.

Applicants must have left prior police service in good standing.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

Candidates will be scheduled to complete a mandatory Peace Officer Professional Standards (POPS) physical agility test.

Must be able to lift/carry 150 pounds or more

Must be able to bend, squat, climb, twist, crawl, reach above shoulder level, kneel, grip, push, pull, and drive for extended periods.

Must be able to sit, stand, and walk for extended periods.

Eyesight must be correctable to 20/20 vision.

Hearing must be within normal acceptable range of 20-25 with or without hearing aid.
