

# RESOLUTION 20-27

## **A Resolution authorizing the Chief of Police for the Kenton County Police Department to enter into a Management Control Agreement with the Kenton County Emergency Communications Board**

**Whereas**, the United States Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation, Criminal Justice Information Services Division publishes *Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Security Policy*; and,

**Whereas**, the Kentucky State Police interprets CJIS policy and sets forth requirements for the provision of CJIS information for use by criminal and non-criminal Justice agencies in the Commonwealth alike; and,

**Whereas**, the Kenton County Emergency Communications Center, “a central dispatch agency”, is defined as a non-criminal justice agency; and,

**Whereas**, the Kentucky State Police requires all non-criminal justice agencies to enter into a “Management Control Agreement” for the purpose of “administration of that portion of computer systems and network infrastructure interfacing directly or indirectly with the state network, LINK for the interstate exchange of criminal history/criminal justice information with a “single criminal justice agency”; and,

**Whereas**, the Kenton County Police Department is a criminal justice agency, has a permanent seat on the Kenton County Emergency Communications Board, whose duty is to “serve as the administrative and policy-making organization for all matters relating to the provision of public safety communication/dispatching services, and shares the same information technologies as provide by Kenton County Technology Services, therefore,

**Be it resolved**, that the Kenton County Chief of Police be given full authority to execute this and any required revision of the Management Control Agreement as required by the Kentucky State Police.
