Where: Independence Courthouse (5272 Madison Pike)



Road Work Update

Snow Removal

The Kenton County Department of Public Works is responsible for snow and ice control on County roads.

Public Works Policy

Each year as new streets are built, snow routes are revised and more resources are needed to treat the roads in a timely manner. Streets are ranked on a priority list from one, or most urgent to three, least urgent.

Snow Emergencies

Level I: Cautious driving is advised.

Level II: Only motorists whose travel is necessary should be on the roadways. Residents are urged to contact their employer to see if they should report to work.

Level III: Essential travel only is advised. Violators are subject to prosecution. Residents are urged to contact their employer concerning work schedules.

During Snow Emergencies, where snowfall accumulation is 2 inches or greater, no vehicle may be parked upon any public road right of way.

Any person violating this ordinance may be issued a citation between \$20.00 to \$100.00.
