Common Code Violations


- Tall grass and weeds
Generally, anything over 5"-6" is considered a violation.
- Outside storage and accumulation of junk and debris
Nothing should be stored outside.
Trash cans, grills, and furniture intended for outdoor use is acceptable.
- Unlicensed and/or inoperable vehicles
All vehicles must be in working condition and have current license plates/tags. A vehicle with flat tires is considered inoperable.
- Off-street parking and paving
All vehicles, including trailers, must be parked on a paved surface.

Kenton County Animal Shelter has four Animal Control Officers who are responsible for enforcing state laws and county ordinances pertaining to the welfare and control of domestic, exotic and wild animals.

Spring is Coming!

There are many different ways to determine when Spring begins, and is highly depended on local culture.

Astronomical: Spring begins on the March equinox (when the sun crosses the celestial equator), between March 19 and 21.

Meteorological: The 3 warmest months are Summer, the 3 coldest months are Winter, and the months in between are either Spring or Autumn. The beginning of Spring can vary greatly depending on the local climate.

Ecological: Biological indicators (the blossoming of certain plants, animal activity, etc.) are used to determine when Spring begins. As with meteorological, this varies greatly based on local climate.

The United States generally uses the Astronomical method to determine the first day of Spring, which this year is **Friday, March 20**. Hooray!
